Bank of Canada Governor Tiff Macklem urged elected officials to consider the inflationary consequences of their spending plans as the central bank tries to cool price pressures.

Macklem, speaking to a committee of lawmakers in Ottawa, said the combined fiscal promises of governments mean that spending may increase at a rate that stokes consumer price inflation, complicating the bank's attempt to bring it back to the two per cent target.

Sadly, shrinking habitat and melting ice are leaving this highly evolved species vulnerable to decline. Biologists report that the species could lose up to 90 per cent of its habitat in the next 60 years. Rangifer tarandus are superbly adapted to deal with snow: their bodies are equipped with a sensitive nose to find vegetation under deep snow and hooves to dig through it to reach the vegetation underneath. But the changing climate is introducing rainy intervals in winter during short periods of warm temperatures, which can cause ice layers to build up, as crust on top of the snow, within the snowpack or — worse — covering the ground like bullet-proof glass, blocking the animals' access to food beneath an ice layer that's impossible for reindeer to penetrate no matter how sharp their hooves. As a result, in Scandinavia today, the herds struggle to find enough food to survive the winter, with some females even aborting their calves from lack of nutrition.

PARIS: Around 66 million years ago, an asteroid bigger than Mount Everest smashed into Earth, killing off three quarters of all life on the planet – including the dinosaurs.

This much we know.

But exactly how the impact of the asteroid Chicxulub caused all those animals to go extinct has remained a matter of debate.

The leading theory recently has been that sulphur from the asteroid's impact -- or soot from global wildfires it sparked -- blocked out the sky and plunged the world into a long, dark winter, killing all but the lucky few.

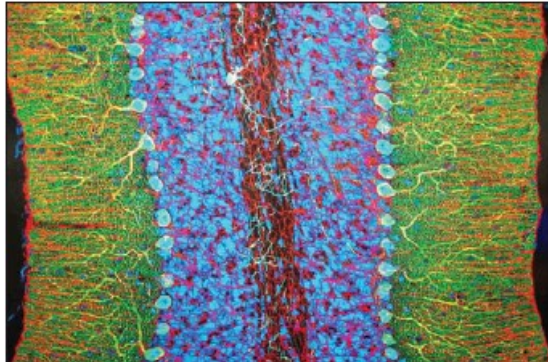

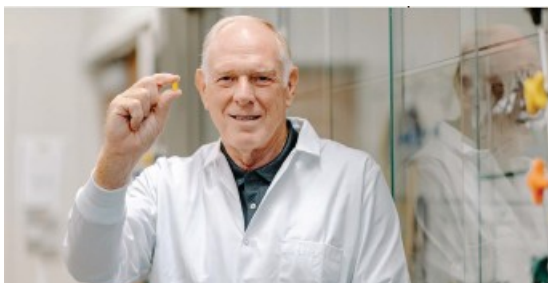
News publishers face tech backlash

Tech companies have found that “hosting news can often be more trouble than it is worth,” and publishers are feeling the results, said Mike Isaac in The New York Times. “Top news sites got about 11.5 percent of their web traffic in the United States from social networks in September 2020, according to Similarweb, a data and analytics company. By September this year, it was down to 6.5 percent.” Publishers are also losing key allies in tech. Facebook’s top news executive, Campbell Brown recently left the company after six years. Google, which had been “the strongest partner to news organizations,” just laid off 45 Google News employees. Popular apps like TikTok and Instagram “generate negligible traffic numbers to media outlets.”

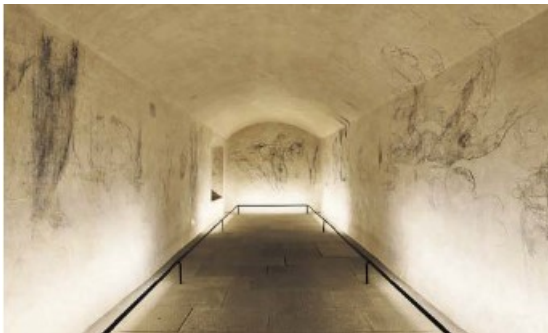

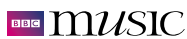
